- The boats are being inspected regularly, with salt water buckets and towels laid in to maintain moisture.
- Last week the boats in the yard were moved to facilitate Kier finishing off repair works along the fence.
- The seats of all our boats have been removed and dried. In the process it was noted that a number of seat pads and cushions are in poor repair with broken zips and clasps and tear/rips in the covers. The costs of this and also

a replacement boat cover are being investigated and indications so far are £1200 for the cover with each seat cover/pads coming in at about £40.

• We also need to upgrade at least 3 of the lifejackets which are all small sizes, and to be fair most of the Club are of standard proportions!

The Committee are at the early stages of exploring a site share with the Sea Scouts. Whilst not ideal it would offer a base for meetings, training and somewhere to store the boats and kit. Negotiations have stalled due to Covid 19 but it is hoped to resume shortly.

As recent easing of restrictions allows up to 6 people from different households to meet and exercise together in an outside environment, Nicky has negotiated group rates for bespoke PT training with Corin Bryant in the park/beach. Details will be on the Notice Board in due course.

For all group activity social distancing and cleaning regimes would need to be observed.
